ELIJAH was first performed in Birmingham in 1846 under the direction of the composer. The oratorio was set to English words, as nearly as possible to the Biblical Text as the music would allow, and the first performance was an outstanding success, with the famous Jenny Lind as Soprano soloist (for her Mendelssohn wrote the outstandingly beautiful aria 'Hear ye, Israel' which opens the second part of the oratorio). Ever since, the work has held the affections of the British public, with its dramatic interpretation of the Bible story, the Chorus alternately singing the parts of the Israelites, and the Priests of Baal, interspersed with some gems of more quiet writing, such as 'He, watching over Israel,' 'He that shall endure to the end' and the famous Contralto air 'O rest in the Lord'. An outstanding moment is the Quartet and Chorus, 'Holy, Holy, is God the Lord' with the Soprano soloist soaring above the Chorus, which seems to be the voices on earth answering with great joy the adoration of the Angels in Heaven.

It is a great pleasure to welcome our Guest Conductor, Mr. Charles Groves to Tunbridge Wells for the first time; Mr. Groves was for 10 years principal conductor and musical director of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, until his retirement from that post a few months ago in order to take up the appointment of Musical Director to the Welsh National Opera Company. He recently conducted two concerts in the Royal Festival Hall at which the soloist was the great Russian 'Cellist, Rostropovitch, and which concerts were enthusiastically acclaimed by the national press. Dr. HAROLD MAY remains the Society's chief conductor, and will be on the rostrum for the next two Concerts, on December 17th, 1961 and March 25th, 1962.

Hervey Alan's great experience in the title role of Elijah and memories of his last appearance in the work at St. John's Church three years ago have compelled his re-engagement to day. He is too well known to need introduction, and we look forward to hearing this exacting role sung again by him.

We are obliged to the Governors of Sadlers Wells for allowing Miss IRIS KELLS and Mr. JOHN STODDART to appear with us, and also extend to Miss SYBIL MICHELOW, from South Africa, a warm welcome.

The Society is indebted to many members of the ROYAL TUNBRIDGE WELLS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA for kindly playing in this concert; their assistance is always appreciated.
