"THE MESSIAH" AT THE GREAT HALL.

In aid of the four local V.A.D. Hospitals, the Francis Foote Choir gave a performance of "The Messiah" at the Great Hall on Wednesday afternoon last. Mr. Francis J. Foote, A.R.A.M., was the Conductor, and the soloists were Miss Margery Strange (soprano), Miss May Purcell (contralto), Mr. Annam Michael (tener), and Mr. Percival Driver (bass). It has been customary for several years past for this Choral Society to give "The Messiah" during Advent, and this year's performance was fully equal to those of former years, despite the disadvantages arising from lack of young men. The inclusion of several Lancashire men in khaki gave the chorus an unusual feature, their voices helping an unusual feature, their voices helping materially in the choruses.
