# St Nicolas Concert at St John's:

#### Friday November 12<sup>th</sup>:

- Please be in the Church by 7.15pm, to ensure we are all in our places and ready to start by 7.30pm sharp.
- As many volunteers as possible by 6.30pm, please, to help arrange chairs and general layout.

### Saturday November 13<sup>th</sup> at St John's:

- Rehearsal will start at 2.30pm in the Church
- Would as many volunteers as possible please come earlier (from 1.30pm onwards) to help set up seating, music desks, lighting etc, so that we can start the rehearsal punctually.
- The choir will finish rehearsal at approx 5.00pm
- **Performance** will start at 7.00pm and members should be ready to take their places by 6.45pm.

  - Please avoid bringing you car if possible because of very restricted parking: where possible arrange to be dropped off/share vehicles/use public transport ....or be prepared to walk some distance from a remote parking space. (There is a public car-park on John St – opposite the "Sainsbury Local" store)

    - Ladies: black skirt or trousers and black long-sleeved top. Men: black dinner jacket or lounge suit: black bow-tie and white shirt.
    - All singers are asked to please wear a Remembrance Poppy.
  - Return of scores/sheet music:

    - Would any member NOT singing in the Concert please return it to Suzie <u>before</u> the 13<sup>th</sup>.
