The tickets are now available from the Assembly Hall, but the Treasurer does retain a number and is able to sell these to choir members who may have just missed the deadline.



Concert day arrangements

Parking.

There is a large car park adjacent to the Assembly Hall, in Crescent Road. Please note that there is a Remembrance Day Ceremony at the War Memorial in the morning and access to the main part of Town will be restricted. The Assembly Hall recommends entering Town via Carr's Corner/Calverley Road. Entrance to the Assembly Hall morning and evening is by the Stage Door at the rear of the Hall.

Timings.

Please arrive at 9.45am, to be seated on stage at 10.00am. There will be a break for lunch. We will line up at the back of the stage at 2.45pm. Concert 3.00pm. It has been decided that on this occasion members of the Choir will be allowed to leave the platform during the interval. Please make sure you return at the appropriate time, 5 minutes before the Interval ends, and line up and go on to the platform in the same way as before the start of the concert.

Taking part.

If you are singing in the Autumn Concert, please make sure your name is on the list. If your name is on the list but you cannot sing in the concert after all, or if you cannot attend the morning rehearsal or will be late, it is essential to tell the Acting General Secretary – Helen MacNab, 01892 526434, email: helenmacnab@yahoo.co.uk – as soon as possible. This is to make sure that we have exactly the right number of seats on stage.

Concert dress.

Ladies: white (not cream) long-sleeved blouses (tucked in), full-length black skirts (black trousers permitted if a black skirt is unavailable, but preferably not on the front row) and black shoes. Jewellery, if worn, must be unobtrusive.

Gentlemen: dinner jacket (or dark lounge suit), white shirt, black bow-tie, black shoes and black socks. There are rooms upstairs behind the stage for changing your clothes, which can be left there during the concert. Poppies to be worn by all members on the left-hand side of blouses and jackets.
