Membership Subs:

November 10th Concert:

• TICKET SALES:

- As Members will be aware, our November Concert is especially ambitious, so it is important that we have a larger than normal audience to help defray the extra costs of staging it.
- So far ticket sales by Members have fallen well short of what we need to achieve, and everyone is asked to promote the concert even more enthusiastically to family, friends, neighbours and work colleagues in order to achieve as nearly as possible a "full house" on the day. Please remember that each ticket sold by our own Members brings in 15% more money to the Society than the same ticket sold via the Assembly Hall Theatre Box Office who withhold a big commission on their ticket sales! After October 14th most tickets have to be passed to the Box Office, so we urge everyone to use these last 2 rehearsals to buy their tickets.
- The Chairman reminds everyone that he will select a special bottle of wine to be awarded to the Member who has sold the most tickets!

• Detailed Arrangements:

- \circ $\;$ $\;$ There will be NO extra rehearsal on the Friday prior to the day of the Concert.
- "Dress Rehearsal" on the morning of the Concert will begin at 10.00 am prompt: please take your seats no later than 09.45 am
- We recognise that we need to be more professional in both our "sits 'n' stands" and in moving onto and off the stage. Nearer the time Rebecca, with the help of our Line Representatives, will "drill" us in these areas.
- Concert Dress:
 - Ladies: black skirts or trousers, black long-sleeved tops; if worn, jewellery must be unobtrusive.

- Men: dinner jackets or dark lounge suits, black bow tie, white shirts.
- Singers are asked to ensure that they use our standard-issue black music-folders on the day: new Members can get these from Diana Blower [our Librarian] at a subsidised price of £3. Members who need to <u>replace</u> their folders will be asked to pay our own full cost of £5.
- As usual at our concerts on Remembrance Day, all singers are asked to please wear a Poppy.
- Pre-Concert Talk:
 - Rebecca will be giving a Pre-Concert talk starting at 2.00pm.
 - Members are of course encouraged to be there for the talk:
 - However, as we are not making a charge for the Talk [it's included in the ticket price] more of the audience are likely to attend than previously, and those with tickets in the Stalls will naturally expect to take the seats they have booked during the talk.
 - Members are therefore asked not to take a seat until very shortly before the start of the talk, and to be as tactful as possible in doing so, to avoid any audience Members feeling that they have been displaced from their rightful seat locations.
 - We will need Stewards for the Talk, who will also need to sell programmes at an earlier time than usual. Volunteers are needed to act in this role – in addition to our usual need for programme sellers from among family and friends who will NOT be singing in the Concert.

Christmas 2013:

Traditional Christmas Concert – SATURDAY December 14th:

- The main Christmas event will be our traditional Concert at 6.30pm in St Mary's Parish Church in Goudhurst.
 - Full details of arrangements will be announced in our next *Newsletter*, but please note that the date is a **Saturday**, rather than a Sunday, as in prior years.
