This is our showcasing concert of the season which will be performed at the Assembly Hall on 9th November 2008. We will be performing with the East Grinstead Choral Society, four professional soloists, an orchestra of over 50 musicians including 4 trumpeters playing within the auditorium and, of course, a Verdi drum for the percussionist to create the earthshaking atmosphere of the *Dies Irae*.
