Annual General Meeting

The date of this will be Monday, 29th October. The Secretary will send a calling notice and agenda to all members with the required 14 days notice.

At the A.G.M the following Officers and members will be standing down – Michael Selway, Gareth Looker, and Sharon Harrison. Grateful thanks go to each of them for their contribution to the smooth running of the Society.

Elena Gente will stand for election as Treasurer. At this time there is no candidate for the post of Publicity Officer – Natalie Beresford had offered to stand but her workload has caused her to withdraw. This is an extremely vital role and you are asked if you have the skills and enthusiasm to participate in all or part of this role. We cannot leave the office unfilled. Jane Read retired earlier in the year as Concert Manager when she moved to Jersey. Barbara Maw has been standing in and will offer herself for election.

At least 2 other members are sought to serve on the Committee and you are asked to contact me (Roy) or Trevor, the General Secretary, if you would like to be a part of this organising body and help shape our future activities.

Rehearsals
