ABOUT GEORGE FRIDERIC HANDEL (1685-1759)



"An ambitious, shrewd, generous, brilliant, and flawed man, hiding in full view behind his public persona."

– Ellen T. Harris

George Frideric Handel was born and raised in Germany but moved to London at the age of 27 and became a British subject. He was highly praised and respected in Britain, and worked as the Composer of Music for the Chapel Royal under George II.

Unusually for a living person, Handel had a statue in his honour erected in Vauxhall Gardens in London. Known for his Italian operas, Handel also wrote several large-scale oratorios in English, and Messiah is one of these, full of famous and sublimely beautiful music. As a child he studied music with Friedrich Wilhelm Zachow, organist at the Liebfrauenkirche, and for a time he seemed destined for a career as a church organist himself.


English audiences took to his 1711 opera Rinaldo, and shortly afterwards Handel moved to England permanently. He impressed King George early on with the Water Music of 1716, written as entertainment for a royal boat outing.

Through the 1720s Handel composed Italian operatic masterpieces for London stages: Ottone, Serse (Xerxes), and other works often based on classical stories.

In the 1730s and 1740s Handel turned to the oratorio which displayed to maximum effect Handel's melodic gift and the sense of timing he brought to big choral numbers.

In 1737 Handel suffered a stroke, which caused both temporary paralysis in his right arm and some loss of his mental faculties.

Blind in old age, Handel continued to compose. He died in London on April 14, 1759. Beethoven thought Handel the greatest of all his predecessors; he once said, "I would bare my head and kneel at his grave".



ABOUT MESSIAH

"An exquisite delight. A fine entertainment"


Composed in just 24 days in the summer of 1741, Messiah is one of the best-known and best-loved choral works in the world. It is said that King George nodded off during one performance of Messiah, only roused by the Hallelujah chorus. He stood bolt upright,



obliging everyone present to stand as well. This has become a firm British tradition and to this day audiences still stand during the Hallelujah chorus.

There is very little doubt that Handel himself was incredibly fond of this particular piece of work. His annual benefits always included Messiah, including at London's Foundling Hospital home for abandoned and orphaned children.

Even after he lost his sight, and in failing health, he insisted on attending a performance in April 1759 at the Theatre Royal in Covent Garden. He died eight days later.



Musical Director, Robyn Sevastos


Robyn graduated from Melbourne University with a BMus, and First Class Honours in Performance. She subsequently moved to England to continue her studies, obtained a Postgraduate Diploma in Piano Accompaniment at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and a Performance Diploma from the Royal College of Music. She performed

extensively as a piano soloist, and accompanied and coached singers and instrumentalists in the UK and abroad As a conductor, she has directed many choral and operatic works, often working with internationally renowned artists. In addition to Royal Tunbridge Wells Choral Society, she is music director of London Opera Productions, Kentish Opera, the Llantilio Crossenny Festival, Sevenoaks Philharmonic Society and Bromley Philharmonic Choir, Her extensive repertoire includes operas by Bizet, Donizetti, Humperdinck, Mozart, Puccini, Rossini, Strauss, Sullivan and Verdi, and Carl Orff's Carmina Burana. She has conducted many major choral works, including Verdi's Requiem at Croydon's Fairfield concert hall, and Bach's St Matthew Passion at St Clement Danes church in London. She has performed at the Royal Albert Hall, the Barbican and the O2 Arena, and at Kensington Palace and Sandringham for HRH King Charles III.

Maria (West Side Story), Eliza Doolittle (My Fair Lady), Mabel (Pirates of Penzance), Josephine (HMS Pinafore) and Elsie (Yeoman of the Guard.) Stefanie recently performed Poulenc's one-woman, one-act opera La Voix Humaine as a live-streamed production on the

Dramatic coloratura soprano Stefanie trained at Trinity College of Music, London graduating with distinction from their postgraduate diploma programme. Having initially trained as a banker in the City of London, she left finance behind for a varied and eclectic performing career. She has performed extensively throughout



internet, taking the opportunity as a result of lockdown to develop a conceptually fresh reading of this intense and tragic piece. Stefanie is equally at home on the concert and oratorio platform and performs in oratorios across the country most recently Mozart's Requiem at Portsmouth Cathedral and Haydn's Nelson Mass at Pamoja Hall in Kent. Away from her mainstream operatic career, she was the inaugural Musical Director for the Portsmouth Military Wives Choir conducting them to chart topping success after recording a track for their number one album In my Dreams from Decca Records. She is currently the Artistic Director and Producer for the Asociación Arturo Darch, directing, producing and performing in a series of productions in Spain; most recently From Broadway to Hollywood, which utilised an all star international cast of singers and full orchestra from London's West End. Stefanie has a busy teaching portfolio as a private singing teacher, coach to the Junior Choristers at Portsmouth Cathedral and as teacher of singing at Portsmouth Grammar School. Stefanie can next be heard in a variety of works including opera galas, Orff's Carmina Burana and Verdi's Requiem. www.stefanieread.com



Mezzo-soprano, Rosamund Thomas

Rosamond Thomas graduated with Distinction from the Vocal Performance Masters program at the Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst, Wien. She has a First Class Honours Bachelors degree from the Royal Academy of Music. Rosamond performed the role of Dido in Purcell's Dido and Aeneas at the Universität (2021), L'Enfant in Ravel's L'Enfant et Les Sortilèges in Theater Schönbrunn

(2020) and Sorceress (Dido) in the Ryedale Festival (2019). She covered Komponist in Strauss's Ariadne auf Naxos in 2021. She sang with the chorus for the Glyndebourne Festival 2022, and remains with the company for their tour. In the Festival, she covered Second Bridesmaid in Le Nozze Di Figaro. As a concert singer, Rosamond has further enjoyed recent concert performances including Handel's Messiah and Israel in Egypt, selected oratorio arias and ensembles in Theater Schönbrunn with Erwin Ortner, Copland's In the Beginning (Mousai Singers), Bach's Christmas Oratorio (Blackheath Centre for Singing), Duruflé's Requiem (Concordia), Dvorak's Stabat Mater (Fulham Camerata) and Mozart's Mass in C Minor (Harrow School). Rosamond is an experienced song recitalist, recently performing recitals in the Bösendorfer Salon and Gesellschaft für Musiktheater in Vienna, and in London singing programmes of songs by Roxanna Panufnik (Ryedale Festival), Ravel's Trois Chansons de Stéphane Mallarmé (Duke's Hall, RAM) and Rachmaninov songs in the Rachmaninov Festival at Pushkin House.

Tenor, Dominic Lee

Worcestershire born Tenor Dominic Lee has been singing professionally since the age of eight. Dominic started as Chorister at Worcester Cathedral in 2004, where over the years he rose through the ranks to become a Lay Clerk there. It was through this and a number of school shows that Dominic found his love for performance.



He went on to study for his undergraduate degree in Music at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire and has just completed a master's degree at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama under the tutelage of John Evans. Dominic has a strong passion for operatic performance. His most recent engagements include chorus in Carmen with Opera Holland Park, Chorus in L'Elisir D'Amore with West Green House Opera and Solo ensemble in The Boatswain's Mate with Spectra Ensemble. Boasting a wide range of oratorio and concert work, Dominic's concert repertoire has seen him perform well known works all around the country. From notable pieces such as Handel's Messiah and Haydn's Creation, to new commissions in the Three Choirs Festival. Dominic's musical tastes don't lie solely in classical music. He has also ventured into the world of musical theatre, performing in the country's largest Christmas show, The Thursford Christmas Spectacular in 2018 and 2019. He has also performed classics from opera to Queen on a SilverSea cruise ship for six months, exploring the world as he performed. Away from music Dominic loves his sport. Particularly rugby and cricket which he has played for many years. Although, sadly due to the risk he's had to retire from rugby at a young age due to the frequent black eyes not looking too good on stage!



Baritone, Peter Grevatt

Peter was born in Hastings and studied theology and philosophy at King's College, London. He studied voice with Jean Austin Dobson, Derek Hammond-Stroud of the Royal Academy of Music and went on to train with Michael Maurel. He trod the boards with Pavarotti and Zancanaro at the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino and his professional debut in a major role was as Mozart's Figaro for London Opera Players, to which he quickly added Malatesta (Don Pasquale) at Holland Park,

Dandini (La Cenerentola), Onegin and a number of other, largely lyric, baritone roles. Over the following decades he has steadily added to his list of nearly ninety rôles, singing for companies such as The Opera Project, Nationale Reisopera, British Youth Opera, Festival dei Due Mondi, Opéra Nationale de Bordeaux, Kentish Opera, Opera à la Carte, the D'Oyly Carte and many others. He regularly performs the popular oratorio canon and other sacred works. 2011 saw the start of an extremely successful, ongoing, association with Saga Holidays. Since then, as a Music Host, Peter has written and presented hundreds of illustrated talks & recitals whilst hosting, for Saga, ten Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra seasons; the Festival

Internacional de Música de Canarias, the International Gilbert and Sullivan Festival holidays, seven seasons of the Arena di Verona Opera Festival along with many trips to Vienna, Cologne & Budapest for similar projects. He is in constant demand on the concert platform and has an extraordinarily wide and eclectic repertoire ranging from the Baroque to Flanders & Swann. Interesting projects in September 2022 include his participation in a concert to mark the 500th anniversary of the death of the French Renaissance composer Jean Mouton at the Basilique Saint-Quentin in which several previously unpublished critical editions were given their first performance.

Orchestra Leader, Andrew Laing

Andrew (Andy) Laing was born in Aberdeen. He started learning the violin when he was five years old and at sixteen was appointed leader of the National String Orchestra of Scotland. He studied at Royal Academy of Music, winning several awards and scholarships. While still a student he was appointed leader of the Morley College Symphony Orchestra, also regularly led the Ealing Symphony



Orchestra, the Hatfield Philharmonic and the Forest Philharmonic. At the RAM Andy formed and led the Locrian String Quartet. The Quartet won many awards, was broadcast on BBC radio and TV and gave numerous first performances of works by contemporary composers. Subsequently he became sub-leader of the BBC Radio Orchestra, then Leader of the London City Ballet Orchestra. Andrew is currently leader of both the Bromley and Maidstone Symphony Orchestras.



Organ, Craig Hudson

Craig Hudson grew up in Poole, Dorset, learning piano and trumpet from the age of eight. He won scholarships to Clayesmore Preparatory and Senior Schools, where he learned to play the organ, and went on to read maths and music at St John's College, Cambridge. From 2005 to 2012, Craig worked at All Souls Church, Langham Place, combining his Christian faith with his love for music and working with young people. Highlights included conducting the All Souls Orchestra and Choir, playing in Prom Praise concerts throughout the UK. Since 2012

Craig has been Music Director at St John's Church, Tunbridge Wells, which he combines with teaching and performing. He enjoys working in many different musical styles, from choral music to jazz. He has directed the nine-voice ladies choir 'Mums n'Roses' since 2013, and has accompanied RTWCS since January 2017.
